Stat. § 809.19(1)(e), which states, in pertinent part, that parties must provide "citations to the authorities, statutes and parts of the record relied on as set forth in the Uniform System of Citation and SCR 80.02."

"*The Bluebook* requires the use and citation of traditional printed sources when available, unless there is a digital copy of the source available that is authenticated, official, or an exact copy of the printed source...." *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation* R. 18.2 (Columbia Law Review Ass'n et al. eds., 20th ed. 2015). Because books published in Books UnBound differ in format from their print counterparts, the print versions of State Bar of Wisconsin PINNACLE books should be cited in official filings.
